The Vicar's Letter

Since the beginning of the Lockdown in March, we have been through many things together in the church. I am sure that as individuals, all readers of the Shield Magazine must have been through the same situation in their own lives. But, we are still here, despite all difficulties we are still facing, to encourage one another and carry on



what we are called to do. As I quoted previously in September parish magazine, St. Paul's words from Philippians (4:12-13) is still relevant to us all.

I know what it is to have little, and I know what it is to have plenty. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being well-fed and of going hungry, of having plenty and of being in need. I can do all things through him who strengthens me. (Philippians 4:12-13, NRSVA)

Yet, we also have to admit that there are so many things that we couldn't do, due to the circumstances. With all the restrictions in place and knowing that Enfield is in the 'Medium' risk zone, we had to make some difficult decisions to keep us all safe. We have a good number of people who are involved as sidesmen on Sundays and we have been expanding our presence in the virtual community too. I believe what we have achieved together is wonderful signs of church growth! So, well done to you all!



Compassion Child - Update

Further to my article in last months magazine which I gave an update on our relationship with Madossé, I have since received an update about the country



where our sponsored child Madossé lives and a general update regarding the work of Compassion through lockdown.

Burkina Faso was locked down because of the Coronavirus pandemic and have recently had some of the restrictions lifted. When the restrictions were in place some people were unable to work to feed their own families, the letter I received explained that a widow who went round door to door to wash families clothing was unable to do so, but through her church received food items and a hygiene kit, since then she is able to provide for her own family.

Another issue was that a child who was new to a Compassion project had to be taken 93 miles by a church partner to a hospital to have emergency operation to remove a kidney stone, the child is reported to be recovering very well.

These are just two examples of issues that have been faced by Compassion, but through generous donors they are able to support these children and families through these difficult times. A card was included with the letter which I have scanned a recent picture and details of when their birthday is.



Please continue to pray for Madossé and the work of Compassion, it is at times of a pandemic that they need our prayers most. I also received a general update about the work of Compassion throughout the world by continent, not individual country.

Latin America

Cases of Coronavirus are rising in this region and the World Health Organisation have said that this is the new epicentre of the pandemic. Compassion have been providing food hygiene kits and clean water to those who need it most. Compassion are providing education using Zoom, WhatsApp and Facebook live; Compassion are also ensuring that all sponsored children are receiving necessary ongoing support.

Prayer Points:

Pray for God's protection for the poorest families in Latin America, which is the new epicentre of the global pandemic. Pray for food security in the region as the UN World Food Programme warns that 14million people could go hungry.

Africa

Floods and locusts have had an effect on the agriculture in this continent, the lockdown from the pandemic has made the situation worse as there are food shortages which is causing prices to rise. It is expected by Compassion that the economic consequences of the pandemic to last a long time which could cause many more people to fall further into poverty. Compassion have been working with church partners to deliver food and nutrition packages. Also, a third of Africans do not have access to clean water, Compassion church partners are meeting the immediate need by providing supplies for hand washing and sanitising, also they are sharing good scientific information on how to stay healthy and how to prevent infection.

Prayer Points:

Pray for a good harvest in Africa, as crops have already been destroyed by locusts and floods.

Pray God will preserve jobs in Africa as the UN warns that half of all jobs in the continent could be lost because of COVID-19.

Asia

Cases of COVID-19 are seeing a reduction in Thailand and Sri Lanka, but cases in Bangladesh, Indonesia and Phillipines have seen a rapid increase in cases. Typhoons have hit Bangladesh and Phillippines recently which has made the situation worse. Families are struggling to work and support themselves, also some child protection issues have arisen. The church partners have risen to the challenge to meet the needs in caring for the vulnerable communities. Churches are regularly providing deliveries of food and hygiene kits. The churches are using modern technology to keep in contact with all children who are sponsored through Compassion.

Each area has their own unique problems which I have summarised above, but the main issue seems to be food shortages and the church partners are working very hard to deliver this to those in need.

Prayer Points:

Please pray for the protection of children who are at greater risk of abuse now they're no longer in school.

Pray for wisdom for authorities in Bangladesh and the Philippines as they deal with the aftermath of devastating typhoons and COVID-19.

Please continue to pray for the work of Compassion who like many other charities working in developing countries are struggling at the moment, but as you will have seen from what I have written above from the update I have received, they are rising to the challenge of meeting needs as they arise.

Fr. Taemin, Violet, Lucy (my daughter) and myself have been covering the cleaning throughout lockdown. Hirers have also been monitoring their areas for cleaning too. Deb are regular cleaner will be back from 1st October. She will clean weekdays only, as there are no parties to cover at this moment in time. The Duty Officers will check the cleaning after the weekend hirers.

We have ask Violet, Bob and Adam to come back and cover as Duty Officer for the evening and weekend hirers. Some hirers want to take their time coming back, such as Badminton, as they are in the vulnerable age group. Uniformed groups are waiting to see when it is safe to come back. So far, it is Pre School, Sticky Fingers, Benedicta (Maths Tutor), Impulse Dance, Jenny from Enfield Wellbeing, Clubbercise, Zumba and Pilates.

I have written a COVID-19 risk assessment for the hall. This has been sent to all our hirers and we have also asked for their risk assessment in order that we all follow the government guidelines.

The government have a new app for test and trace; NHS COVID-19. The new NHS COVID-19 app is the official NHS contact tracing app for England and Wales. The more of us that use it, the better we can control coronavirus. In the church and hall, we have placed QR code posters, so that you can scan yourself using this app.

Our Annual/Quarterly services have been done in the hall for the electrics, the lift, the boilers and ADT have serviced the alarm and advised us that the fire panel was showing signs of damage, so we had a new fire alarm panel fitted, which is situated in the hall lobby. We also got the window cleaner back for the hall and vicarage.

Things are slowly coming together and I must thank Fr. Taemin and Violet for their support and help. I really couldn't have done it without them!

Pandemic sparks transformation of parish magazine

Article from 'CRE' written by Dave Hall:

In the year of 'more tech, vicar?' live streaming has become essential for church services and even the humble church magazine has been digitally transformed.

According to a recent poll by CRE exhibitor parishpump.co.uk, who supply graphics and editorial material to nearly 1800 church publications, many

magazines have coped surprisingly well during lockdown.

In March, the Church of England warned against paper delivery of magazines because of Covid-19. 'For this reason, parishes are encouraged to look to digital communication...' said the notice. In response, Parish Pump subscribers report that a quarter of parish magazines ceased publication but around two-thirds went digital or are now producing both printed and digital versions.

Anne Coomes, Parish Pump's editor, said: 'It is great news that so many have gone digital - we warmly welcome it. Far from stopping your church magazine production during this crisis, we think it is critical to keep it going. People all over the country are now more isolated from their local church family than they have ever been in their lives. A church magazine can help keep them in touch with each other.

'In fact, we hope that many of the churches who at first decided to simply stop their magazines will now reconsider, and at least try the digital option for a few months. Of the hundreds of church magazine editors to have gone digital, many are attracting new readers at this time.'

Since 1965 Mothers' Union has run the "Away From It All" (AFIA) programme of experiences and holidays across Britain and Ireland and has helped many families rebuild relationships that had become strained, fractured or even been kept apart.

Most of us had our lives turned upside down in a matter of days due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We had to come to terms with restrictions on everyday activities, such as seeing family and going to Church and School. Many of us also had to become technology gurus overnight and reinvented our dining tables to be our new offices! It was an adjustment for us all. But while all this was happening, an army of individuals were keeping us all going – from shop workers to care workers, refuse collectors to bus drivers, nurses to delivery drivers. Without them, our lockdown would have been so much harder. They ensured we were as safe as possible, often putting themselves at risk in the process.

We now want to say a huge thank you for all they have done, which is why we have used all our experience from AFIA to launch our *Thank You Key Workers Appeal* in order to recognise those who have continued to go above and beyond to help others. While all the work our key workers have done has been a triumph of compassion and care, it has meant a great deal of personal sacrifice – including the very important quality family time.

We want to provide similar AFIA day experiences and short breaks for key workers to help them rebuild family connections and togetherness. We especially want to provide this for families who have been kept apart or who are on low incomes, so they will be prioritised.

The appeal officially launched on the 5 July and we have been working hard to increase awareness of it outside the Mothers' Union movement, so that we can not only raise vital funds but also raise the profile of the amazing work we do through AFIA every year! 


